The School Opal Card

The School Opal card will officially launch its new online application for relevant parents and students travelling in the Opal public transport region on Monday 2 November.

Just like current paper travel passes, the School Opal card gives eligible students free travel to and from school on school days. However, the School Opal card makes travel simpler, because now students don't need multiple application forms and passes if they use different transport operators within the Opal network.

Students with school travel passes this year will not need to apply for a School Opal card unless they are changing schools, campus, their home address or moving from year 2 to 3 or year 6 to 7.

Those students who do not need to apply will have a School Opal card sent to your school for the beginning of the first term in 2016.

Year 10 Peer Reading Tutors



Australian Business Week 2015

Northern Beaches Secondary College has undertaken to run a program called *ABW Enterprise Education*. This involves students from Balgowlah Boys, Cromer, Mackellar Girls and Manly Campuses for a one week period in which they participate in a business simulation program.

ABW at Northern Beaches Secondary College is to be held:

Monday 23rd November to Friday 27th November 2015 at Freshwater Campus

The ABW program is designed to encourage independent and cooperative learning skills and to develop an enterprise mindset prior to entering the

workforce or proceeding to further study. It introduces participants to the issues of coping with stress and effective time management, both major issues that impact on students in the Preliminary and HSC years of high school.

Participants assume management roles in businesses and make decisions (good or bad!) that affect business performance. For schools, the programs replace the regular curriculum for a one-week period, allowing students to immerse themselves in the virtual business world.

Because it's experiential learning, rather than a lecture, it's invaluable in terms of encouraging team work and a sense of responsibility, exercising decision making skills, and boosting confidence. It's also an exciting and fun learning experience and a break from the routine of the typical school week.

How does the ABW School Program work?

Students are divided into teams of 10-12 and spend five days working together. During these five days, the students will engage in:-

- Managing a business through computer simulation
- Learning from guest speakers from business and the community
- Develop a new product of their own invention
- Create a video and trade display to advertise that product
- Give a verbal and written report of the week's activities
- Attend a simulated job interview
- Interact with business people and teachers as facilitators
