These opportunities supplement the school curriculum and are designed to foster individual talents. I will be attending the student leadership camp on Monday and will be working with the students, enlisting their input into our next 2018-2020 school plan.

CROMER CAMPUS IS GROWING

This week I emailed all parents with an urgent call for assistance. I reported that the school is growing in student numbers and accordingly we need to hire more teachers and staff to ensure every child continues to receive the high quality education we all expect. When hiring new teachers through interview we always welcome a member of the parent community to serve on the decision making panel. It is crucial that parents have a say in this process.

I was pleasantly overwhelmed with the response and thank the many parents who offered to assist. Next year we have anticipated Year 7 numbers of over 120 students (5 classes) and an anticipated school population of over 600 students. The school population is expected to continue growing and as this occurs

we will be hiring more and more staff that will enhance the current professional, caring and committed staff we already have in the school.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Over the last school holidays further painting of classrooms occurred, landscaping of some of the gardens and play areas continued, drainage repairs were made to some walkways where flooding is prone and you may have noticed that our new digital school signs have just been erected. Over the coming weeks these signs will be connected to power and commissioned. Thanks go to the P&C who worked tirelessly to fund this project and who are

additionally funding more outdoor seating for our students which should be installed before 2018.

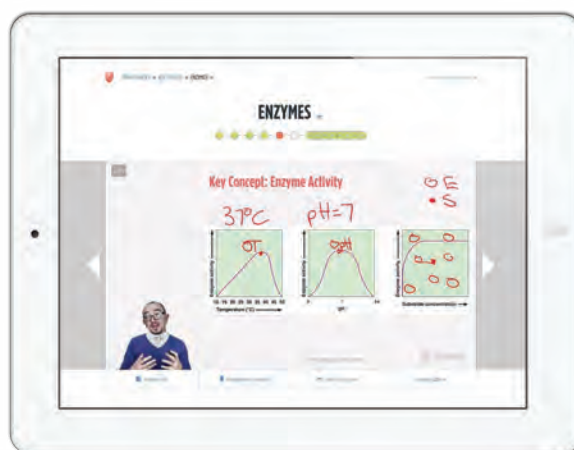

Highlights included the wonderful Science experiment videos, interviews with former students, and the Kindness Project whereby some lucky audience members received a random act of kindness gift.

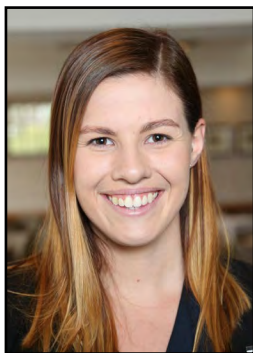
There were a number of video clips shown featuring students enjoying their lessons and participating in activities. Everyone enjoyed a delicious supper on the mezzanine level.

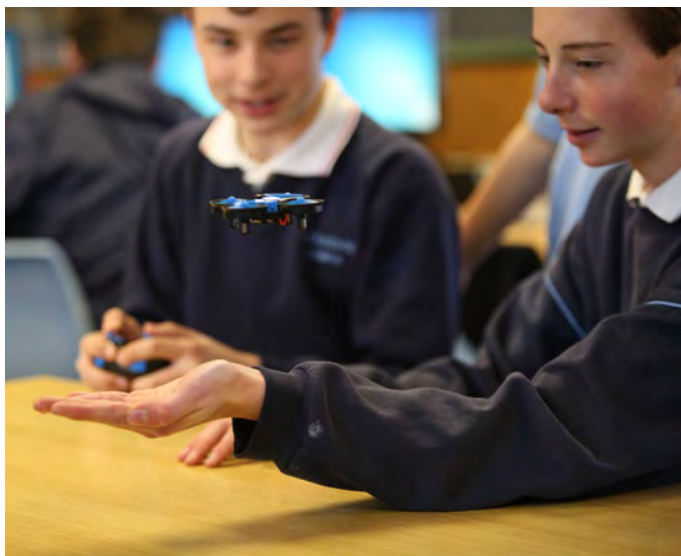
There is a lot happening in the Coding world and a lot of Coding happening Cromer.

FULL DAY OF CODING

Year 9 Information & Software Technology (IST) students were mentors and leaders for a select group of Cromer Primary School students at a recent coding workshop. The all day workshop allowed students to explore microprocessors, remote control technology and Arduino coding.

A group of interested students meets Friday lunchtimes in C106. Students from all years are welcome and have the opportunity to work with the LEGO NXT devices as well as Crack the Code Arduino kits.





PARTNERSHIP WITH MUSEUM OF APPLIED ARTS AND SCIENCES (MAAS)

In a sponsorship deal with MAAS Cromer Campus received 18 Crack the Code ThinkerShield sets, each containing an Arduino board and a variety of electronic components. These will be used as resources in the implementation of a coding unit of work in the new Technology (Mandatory) syllabus.

GAMEMAKER CODING

Year 9 IST students have just completed a unit of work where they designed and created a platform game using GameMaker. The games were all of a high standard.

YEAR 12 SOFTWARE DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT (SDD) PROJECTS

The Year 12 SDD class have completed their major programming projects. These Projects form a large proportion of the students' final HSC assessment marks. Students use a variety of languages, including GML, XML and JavaScript to produce a wide range of applications.

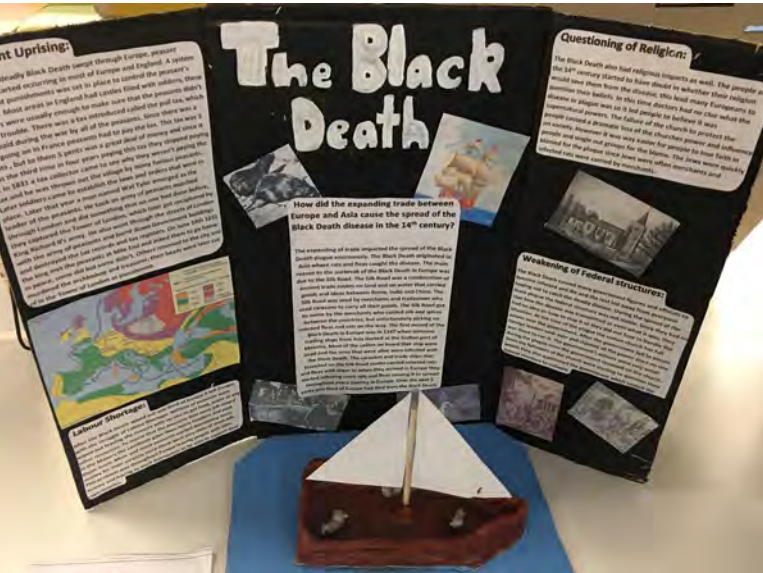

rope, Africa and Asia, and the many bizarre and desperate attempts to contain this terrifying death sentence.

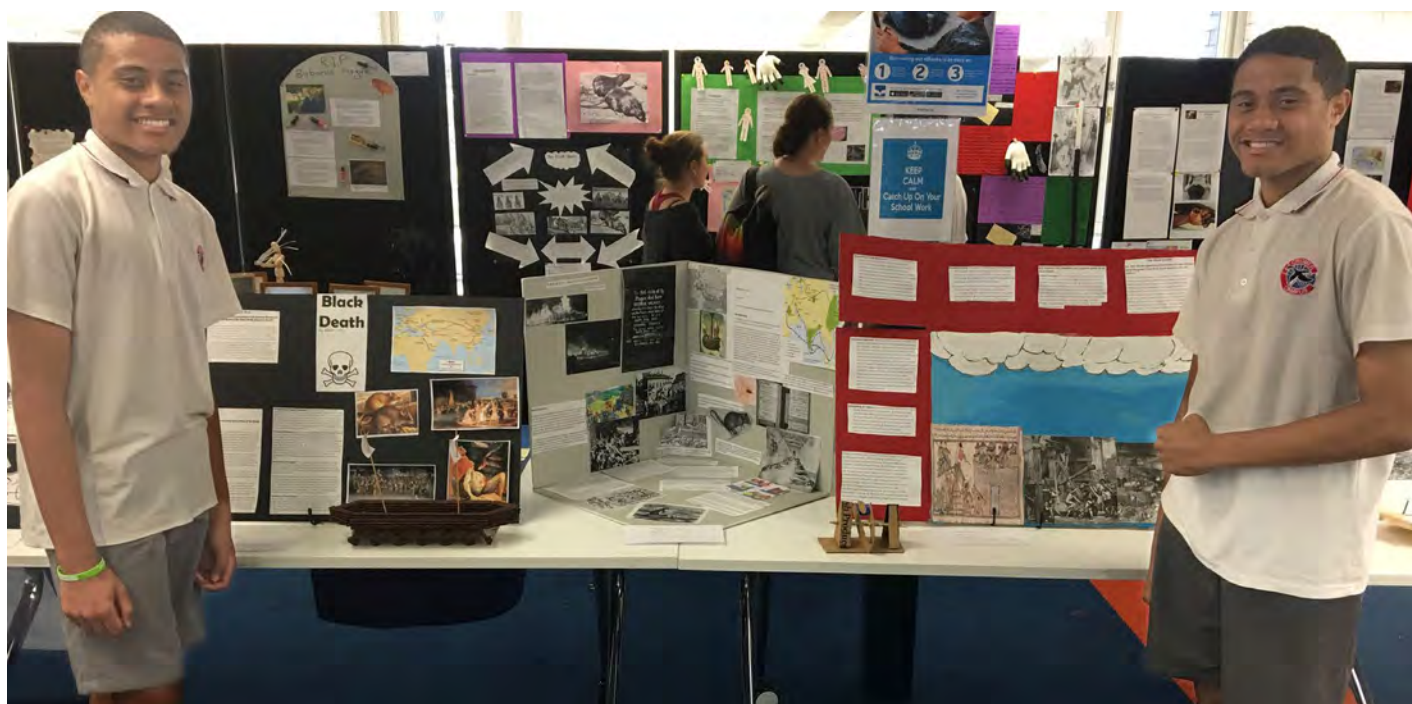
The range of presentation styles and standard again was very impressive and was a hit with the public on the night.

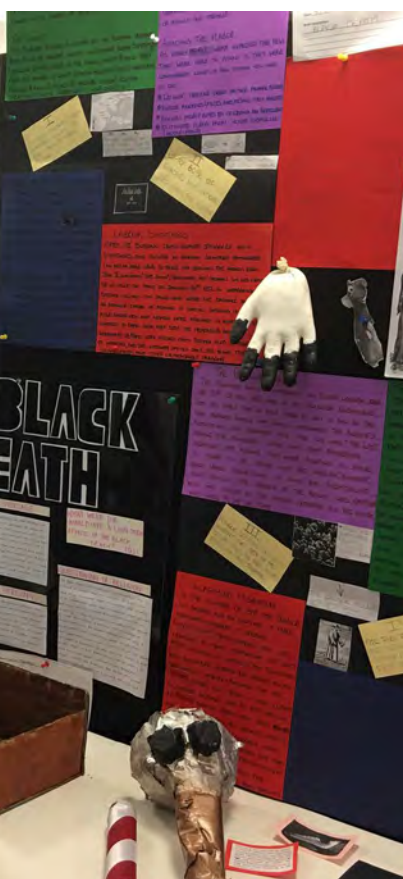
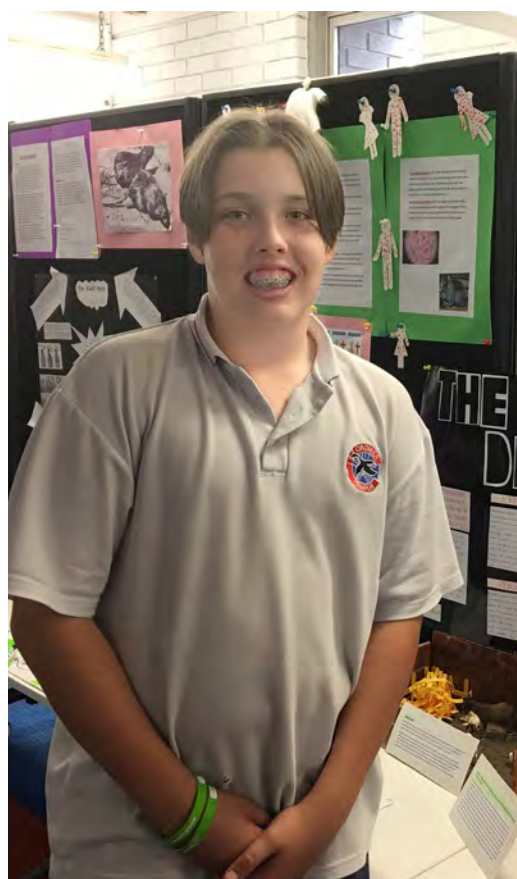
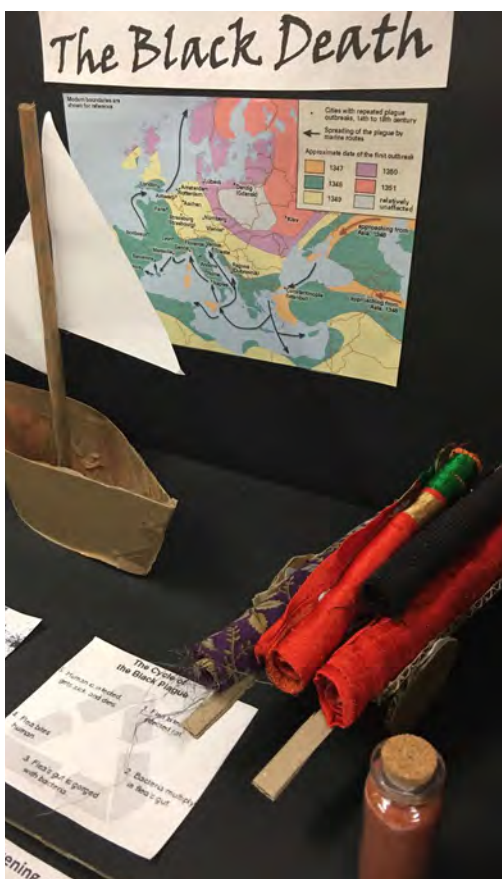

Students studied the numerous theories surrounding this mystical island isolated in the Pacific Ocean, the purposes and building of the island's

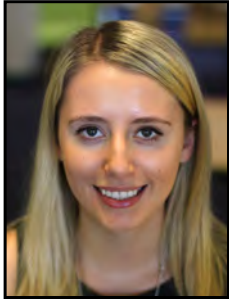
famous Moai statues, as well as what lead to the loss of the two tribes - the Long Ears and the Short Ears.
