HSIE FACULTY THE STORY OF AN IRAQI REFUGEE

Visiting speakers to our campus really serve to put a face to the topic our students are currently studying. n Friday afternoon Year 9 and Year 10 HSIE students, Year 12 Legal Studies and Senior Geography students had the opportunity to listen to the amazing story of Daniel Saeed, our 2017 Refugee Speaker who was hosted by the HSIE department.

Daniel is a Mandean who was born in Iraq into a wealthy family of gold traders and university teachers. While living under the dictatorship of Saddam Hussein and the ensuing American War that ravaged his country during the 1990s and 2000s, they were targeted and he was forced to flee Iraq with his family when he was just 13 years old.

Our students learnt how at such a young age and under extremely dangerous circumstances, he travelled across Iraq into Jordan where he was forced to worked illegally to support his entire family of six (rent and food) for four years while they all awaited resettlement. Their first application to resettle in Australia was refused due to poverty and stress related illnesses, but not giving up, Daniel found work with Save the Children in Jordan and the family was finally accepted into Australia when he was 18.

Arriving in this country he had no English language skills, but with the determination that our students were so inspired by, he has now completed a Diploma in Community Services at TAFE and a degree in Social Work at University, allowing him to give back to Australia as a much needed youth worker and refugee ambassador, helping youth at risk. His siblings have also taken the opportunity to become successful in Australia, becoming highly regarded in the fields of architecture, law and a criminology.

Every student and teacher was able to take something away from Daniel's engaging two hour presentation of his incredible story.

Our students fought furiously against North Sydney Girls in their independent competition, and landed a few hard hitting legislative blows and points of order against North Sydney Boys during the final rounds.

Adjudicated by former Justice of the Supreme Court, the Hon. Robert Hulme (1993-2012), the boys were recognised for their sophisticated delivery of effective legislation, with feedback saying:

"On the scores, they defeated North Sydney Girls HS 431-408. Our guest adjudicator, Robert Hulme (former Justice of the Supreme Court 1993-2012), expressed his shock when he found out that your Cromer team consisted of three Year 9 students against North Sydney Girls' Year 10 students - two of whom had previous debating experience."

When speaking to the judges for their round, they said that Ethan Steele made a phenomenal performance. He raised meritorious points and had strong comebacks to criticisms of the opposing case.


